Thank you for your comments on the draft Northampton Local Plan Part 2.

The policy team is in the process of recording comments and I have the following query related to yours.

You provide the following text under question 4(1):

Healthcare infrastructure

We welcome the recognition (para 120) of the need to identify and secure health care facilities / provision in relation to new development. The model of health service delivery in the county is evolving. Health sector partners are working together with local government as part of the Northamptonshire Health & Care Partnership to develop new service models of health, community and social care services. Health sector partners will need to work closely with NBC to ensure effective provision is delivered in local communities and to meet the needs of new developments.

However, paragraph 120 of the draft LPP2 does not relate to health infrastructure, but to housing:

120. The following needs to be considered:

- Much of the identified under-delivery so far has been the result of slower rates of housing completions in the Sustainable Urban Extensions than anticipated
- The short term housing supply is constrained by the JCS's heavy reliance on large SUEs for substantially meeting the Borough's housing needs
- The Council has researched alternative sites in the borough exhaustively through its Call for Sites and Land Availability Assessments. There are no other sources of supply that could address this short term shortfall

I have assumed, therefore, that the incorrect paragraph has been referenced. As such, please can you clarify which paragraph you are making reference to?

The following comments are made in relation to the health and wellbeing elements of the content of the Northampton Local Plan Part 2 Submission Draft.

They are made in the context of the following:

National Planning Policy Framework:

- 8. Promoting healthy and safe communities
- 91. Planning policies and decisions should aim to achieve healthy, inclusive and safe places which:
- c) enable and support healthy lifestyles, especially where this would address identified local health and well-being needs for example through the provision of safe and accessible green infrastructure, sports facilities, local shops, access to healthier food, allotments and layouts that encourage walking and cycling.
- 92. To provide the social, recreational and cultural facilities and services the community needs, planning policies and decisions should:
- b) take into account and support the delivery of local strategies to improve health, social and cultural well-being for all sections of the community;

Northampton Borough faces significant challenges in relation to health and wellbeing. For example

- -Life expectancy was significantly worse than the England average. (2015-17)
- -68.1% of its population were classified as overweight or obese, which has significant health and wellbeing implication. (in 2017/18)
- -22.7% of children in school reception year were classified as overweight, rising to 33.7% for school year 6.(https://fingertips.phe.org.uk/profile/public-health-outcomes-framework)

Poor health has implications for:

Individual and community wellbeing.

Demand for health and care services.

Productivity and the local economy.

Northamptonshire Health & Wellbeing Strategy

The LPP2 seems to make no reference to the Northamptonshire Health & Wellbeing Strategy and the objectives identified within this key partnership strategy. The health and wellbeing strategy explicitly recognises the role of places in supporting healthier lifestyles and the need to do so given the health and wellbeing challenges faced in the county including Northampton Borough. This should be addressed in accordance with para 92b of the NPPF.

Paragraph 60

Paragraph 60 of the Northampton Borough Draft Local Plan Part 2 states that:

The above table demonstrates that there is a need to ensure that the Borough is better equipped to deal with meeting people's health requirements, particularly in light of its growing population. Within Northampton, there are a range of public and private health facilities including Northampton General Hospital, GP surgeries, dentists, pharmacists and other health care providers.

This seemingly focusses on healthcare provision for those who are ill. While this is critical, we feel there should also be a recognition of the need to support healthier lifestyles within the communities of Northampton Borough and thus prevent ill health.

Neighbourhood centres

We welcome the recognition that 'the Local Plan also has an important role to play in achieving a much healthier lifestyle and an inclusive community' (para 159)

The LPP2 states that neighbourhood centres perform a variety of roles including promoting of social interaction and supporting a healthier lifestyle.

While the provision of access to local services is an important contributor to wellbeing, the LPP2 makes no recognition of the potential negative wellbeing impacts of neighbourhood centres which may contribute to poor health and wellbeing through the proliferation of access to food and other services that are less likely to lead to a healthier lifestyle (alcohol / unhealthy food).

Public health approaches acknowledge that overweight / obesity is a complex issue that must be tackled in a variety of ways. However, one key factor is the food and drink environment.

Public Health England states:

This is primarily because we are living in an obesogenic environment where less than healthier choices are the default, which encourage excess weight gain and obesity.

The Foresight report states that while achieving and maintaining calorie balance is a consequence of individual decisions about diet and activity, our environment, and particularly the availability of calorie-rich food, now makes it much harder for individuals to maintain healthier lifestyles.

The increasing consumption of out-of-home meals – that are often cheap and readily available at all times of the day - has been identified as an important factor contributing to rising levels of obesity.'

The reality is that many neighbourhood centres can contribute to poor health and wellbeing, through a concentration of provision of less healthy options and limited healthy options. It is disappointing that there is no recognition of this or any policy approach to seek to address it.

Healthcare infrastructure

We welcome the recognition (para 210) of the need to identify and secure health care facilities / provision in relation to new development. The model of health service delivery in the county is evolving. Health sector partners are working together with local government as part of the Northamptonshire Health & Care Partnership to develop new service models of health, community and social care services. Health sector partners will need to work closely with NBC to ensure effective provision is delivered in local communities and to meet the needs of new developments.

Summary

While the various references to health and wellbeing within the Local Plan Part 2 are welcomed, we feel that a specific Health and Wellbeing Policy would be more effective. A specific health and wellbeing policy would bring some of these together and provide focus and emphasis on the importance of addressing wellbeing. A requirement for Health Impact Assessment for major developments (at a level / scale appropriate to the development proposals) would also provide a systematic way for ensuring that health and wellbeing implications of development proposals are considered and that opportunities for new development to contribute to community health and wellbeing are maximised.

This is an approach that has been taken by both of the other local planning authorities within West Northamptonshire in their Local Plans.

The text of South Northamptonshire Council's proposed Health and Wellbeing policy is attached for information.
